120.0 Report from the flooding meeting held 22/1/2020	
120.1 MH reported: The meeting was convened by WLDC Cllr Darcel. About twenty people attended. In an open forum people aired their concerns and opinions about how to prevent flooding. There were various opinions of what caused the flooding, one being a lack of routine maintenance. LGPC has some funding to help relieve the flood risk but the issue is where to use it. Sandbags, road closure signs, traffic cones were considered. Also, items to seal doors and air bricks were considered. Some of those affected by flood water were elderly. The flood authorities were overwhelmed and there were no resources available to help people at Langworth. A thought was: if people knew about the flood authorities' strategic plans, they could prepare for a flood event.	
IF gave a resume of what caused the breech in banks of the Barlings Eau at Short Ferry. Most agreed, had the breech not occurred, the flooding at Langworth may have been much more severe.	
A member of the public said flood water also overwhelms the sewage system and toilets cannot be used.	
MH suggested, the authorities, LCC, Anglian Water, Environment Agency, may have an overview of the flood risk in a large area but not be as well informed about how Langworth would be affected. Perhaps a consultant could be employed to prepare a report?	
IF said the person at LCC, (the lead flood authority) is Dr David Hickman. IF also said a report about flooding at Wainfleet will be released soon. This has taken several months. Perhaps a similar enquiry may investigate the Barling Eau Breech.	
In the first instance clerk to write to LCC and Anglian water to ask how they see the flood risk at Langworth.	
MH promised the public meeting that the issues would be reported to the parish council. PC resolved to investigate the cost of employing a consultant to report about Langworth flood	
risks. MH proposed: the council should investigate the cost. Seconded by JM. Vote; all in favour.	Clerk
